 - A) [4 points] What was <u>your first computer</u>? When did you get it? What did you do with it? Refer to the picture you selected as appropriate.
 - B) [4 points] Think of an experience in your life in which computers, or computing technology, played an important role. (This need not be your first computer.) For example, did a computer enable you to have a critical conversation? Influence your choice of major? Teach you something that was critical in a later situation? How would things be different if that experience had not happened? Describe what computing technology was involved, and what influence it had on you.
