What did I do inside the Senate?

- Provide technical analysis of proposed AI legislation
 - Plus NASA, commercial space, and aviation legislation
- Develop ideas for new AI legislation; forge bipartisan teams
- Meet with constituents, companies, and federal agencies to capture their priorities and concerns
- Provide staff training on use of AI within the office
- Learn how Congress gets things done



Congress worries about the same AI topics as everyone else

Safety Bias Deception **Environmental** Copyright Liability impacts National **Elections** Education security

What can Congress do about it?

Investigate and learn

- Hold hearings and investigations
- Direct studies by federal agencies

Legislate: provide direction

- Grant agency authority
- Direct development of standards
- Define procedures (e.g., licensing, certification)

Oversight

- Hold hearings and investigations
- Provide feedback to agencies
- Request Government Accountability Office (GAO) reports

Funding: establish the budget

- Appropriate funds for agencies
- Create "earmarks" for projects (outside of agencies)
- Levy taxes

b Investigate and learn: Senate Al Insight Forums

- A new approach!
- Sept Dec. 2023
- Instead of <u>committee</u> hearings with ~3 witnesses, convene 20+ diverse experts (industry, government, academia, think tanks, unions, civil society, military, venture capital)
- Nine <u>Senate-wide</u> events each focused on an Al-related topic: Innovation, workforce, high impact areas, civil rights, elections, privacy and liability, explainability and copyright, risks and doomsday scenarios, national security

> Al Forum outcome: Senate Al Policy Roadmap

- Bipartisan consensus on AI priorities for the Senate
 - Innovation: funding for AI R&D (e.g., NAIRR, AI Grand Challenges) and implementation (e.g., NIST, standards, testbeds, cybersecurity)
 - Workforce: training, immigration
 - Develop case-by-case requirements (explainability, testing, evaluation) on <u>high-risk</u> uses of AI
 - <u>Elections</u>: address deception, election security
 - ... and more



- National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA)
 - Aerial refueling with AI (pilot program)
 - Al for Navy shipyard automation
 - DoD Al bug bounty program
 - Prize competition for AI watermarking
- FAA Reauthorization Act
 - AI/ML to improve airport efficiency and safety
 - AI/ML/simulation for air traffic controller training
- Fire Grants and Safety Act
 - Assessment of AI and ML methods to inform oversight and inspection decisions for nuclear reactors and materials

Federal AI legislation activity – 119th Congress



TAKE IT DOWN Act

- Prohibits online posting of non-consensual intimate images (real or Al-generated)
- One Big Beautiful Bill Act
 - \$150M for DoE to work on "transformational" AI models
 - \$1.4B for DoD use of AI:
 - \$450M for AI for shipbuilding
 - \$124M for AI for testing weapons
 - \$145M for "one-way attack unmanned aerial systems"
 - \$250M for the "Al ecosystem"
 - \$250M for Al Cyber Command
 - \$200M for AI to audit DoD financial statements
- GENIUS Act regulates cryptocurrency (stablecoins)
 - Seek public comments on AI to detect money laundering

b Legislating artificial intelligence

- Develop a list of ideas for AI-related legislation

- Develop and mature the ideas with a great team

b Lack of Al literacy gets us in trouble

Two US lawyers fined for submitting fake court citations from ChatGPT

Law firm also penalised after chatbot invented six legal cases that were then used in an aviation injury claim

"We made a good-faith mistake in failing to believe that a piece of technology could be making up cases out of whole cloth."

Air Canada Has to Honor a Refund Policy Its Chatbot Made Up

The airline tried to argue that it shouldn't be liable for anything its chatbot says.





- What are the steps? Is there a flowchart?







A BILL

- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "Consumer Literacy
- 5 and Empowerment to Advance Responsible Navigation of
- 6 Artificial Intelligence Act" or the "Consumers LEARN AI
- 7 Act".





Next steps

- Commerce committee consideration
- House companion bill (Sept. 19)
- Re-introduce in the 119th Congress

> 119th Congress: The bill is back (May 8, 2025)

S.1699: Artificial Intelligence Public Awareness and Education Campaign Act

- Sens. Young (R-IN), Schatz (D-HI), Rounds (R-SD), and Kelly (D-AZ)
- Hybrid of the 2024 Consumers LEARN AI Act (S.4838) + a 1-year AI literacy campaign bill from 2024 by Sens. Young & Schatz (S.4596)
- 5-year public Al literacy campaign led by the Department of Commerce with NIST and NTIA (with use cases)
- No national strategy
- No funds are appropriated
- Now waiting on the Commerce committee





Summary – Congress and Al

- Congress is hungry for technical expertise
 - 36 AAAS congressional fellows for ~90 openings
 - Congress wants to get things right
 - Al literacy is a priority
- Congress on the inside isn't what you see in the media
 - Daily hard work, research, negotiation, desire to make the world a better place
 - Vs. sensationalism, scandals, sound bites, personalities
- Individual voices (yours!) can have large influence
